	<u>Ephemerals- Arriving March 2026</u>			IMPORTANT!!		
	!!!!!!Ephemerals require sunlight in the early spring through bare deciduous trees followed by shade from the trees leafing out. AVOID EVERGREEN SHADE AREAS!!!!!!			Plan to plant more than one ephemeral. Plant perennials and other late blooming perennials around them to avoid bare areas after the ephemerals fade away and to help avoid invasives from taking over the planting area.		Leave the leaves in the fall to help protect dormant ephemerals over winter. Some good companion spring blooming perennials include: Woodland Phlox-phlox divaricata, Columbine-Aquilegia canadensis, Foam Flower- Tiarella cordifolia, Wild Geranium, Geranium maculatum. You can also add native ferns and sedges in between. Dont forget to add summer and fall blooming perennials for a full season of blooms. Ephemerals require moist, well drained, humus-rich and slightly acidic soil that mimics forest floor. Please do your own additional research before planting. Best of Luck! :)
